MENTORED HUNTERS UNDER 7 COULD RECEIVE TAGS

- All mentored hunters – including those under 7 years old – would get big-game harvest tags with their permits if a proposal before the Pennsylvania Board of Game Commissioners is given final approval.
- Will be brought back to the January meeting for a final vote.

MORE AG TAGS COULD BE HELD AT A TIME

- Presently, Ag Tag hunters can hold no more than four permits at a time. The proposal would remove the limit on the number of Ag Tags a hunter can hold at a time.

PUBLIC PLAYS IMPORTANT ROLE IN MONITORING EHD

- EHD has hit some parts of the country extremely hard this year.
- EHD is spread to deer when they are bitten by infected midges, small insects often called “no-see-ums.” Because EHD is spread by midges, it emerges in late summer and remains a threat to deer until temperatures drop and the midges die off, usually at the first hard frost. But in local areas where EHD is present, deer mortality can be severe.
- The Game Commission can be contacted, round the clock, at 1-833-PGC-WILD.

SUNDAY HUNTING IS HERE

- New law repealing the state's previous ban on Sunday hunting has taken effect.
- A total of 13 Sundays have been approved for 2025. From Sunday, Sept. 14 through Sunday, Dec. 7, Sunday hunting is permitted within any established hunting season, except for migratory game bird seasons.
- In state parks, Sunday hunting is only permitted on the three Sundays initially approved for the 2025-26 hunting seasons – Nov. 16, Nov. 23, and Nov. 30.

1. Our West Nile Virus program mosquito surveillance season has come to an end in Beaver County as of the end of September. Check out our attached report from our WNV program specialist to read all about how the numbers in Beaver County looked this year. Surveillance season has ended, but mosquitoes are very much still active at this time of year, especially on these continuing warmer days. Be sure to wear repellent when you go outside!
2. Summer tick surveillance ended in August, fall surveillance began on the 1st of October and will run through the end of the month. Ticks are very active this time of year, so be diligent as you head into the woods this fall, be sure to wear repellent, use permethrin on your clothing, and conduct tick checks on yourself and your dogs when you come in from the field.
3. September saw a very successful open house event for our Wright Brothers Dairy Farm Ag Conservation project show casing agricultural conservation in Beaver County with the completion of that collaborative \$3 million project in North Sewickley township. An article about this project was published in the Farm and Dairy on Thursday October 2, 2025. 4. There are several other ag conservation projects under construction in Beaver County right now that are funded by ACAP and Growing Greener funding.
5. Education in September was relatively quiet, giving time to prepare for the busy fall season. There are several school field trips on the books, as well as adult wetland tours of the grounds and a few traveling education events in the community.

6. As a reminder our grounds are open for limited hunting opportunities including archery and waterfowl. There is very little water on our grounds currently so waterfowl hunting will most likely be very limited if any, but you are always welcome to come try.

Lake Erie Fishing:

Anglers that got out on the lake report that walleye fishing is still amazing. The bite seems to be around 71-75 FOW. Divers with spoons are the easiest way to fish the deeper water. As for the streams, we still need a huge amount of rain to make a difference and some cooler temperatures. If you do want to try your luck for steelhead, the mouths, and the beach fishing at first light seem to be the ticket. Do not forget you can check lake conditions on the Avonia and Walnut creek cameras. Good luck to everyone going out. Reference link below for current fishing reports.

Local river fishing:

Fishing is still pretty good going into the fall months. Species like walleye, sauger, catfish, pike, and bass are active. A good tactic this time of year is to find baitfish in hiding spots that hold heat (green veg, rocky areas, docks). Try matching the hatch, seasonal bait fish patterns like minnow, or shads, fast moving baits like crankbaits, or slow down with jigs mimic dying baitfish.

National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP)

- Beaver County NASP Competitive Teams:
 - Riverside – Head Coach: Mike Kowalski
 - Beaver – Head Coach: Russ Sabo
 - New Brighton – Head Coach: Unknown
 - Central Valley – Head Coach: Heather Berry
- Archery Committee has contacted the local NASP coaches to inquire about volunteer opportunities and request support for Archery-related events in the local area.

- Supporting local NASP programs offers an opportunity to host a team at local Sportsmen's clubs; hosting teams should lead to new members and increase attendance at local club events.
- Long term goal: Beaver County starts Scholastic 3D Archery (S3DA) west of Harrisburg and brings the program to western PA.
- So far: Riverside has responded.
- NASP Bullseye State Tournament this year is scheduled for 20 March 2026 in Manheim, PA
 - Interested in filling the venue with exhibitors/vendors and organizations/groups (local and national networking connections for archers)
 - NASP/IBO 3D Archery state tournament was tentatively scheduled for 20 March 2026; pending official NASP statement released 18 OCT 2025 about IBO partnership.

Explore Bowhunting

- Archery Trade Association has partnered with the Pennsylvania Game Commission to bring the Explore Bowhunting curriculum to the state of Pennsylvania. The program includes an educator-friendly curriculum, media packets, and equipment kits that compliment a school classroom.
- PGC Shooting Sports division was contacted to receive information; MTF on implementing in classrooms/clubs across the county.

Youth Foundation

- The BCSC Youth Foundation is in the planning phase of adding an archery event to our annual rotation of youth events.
 - Archery Event should consist of a welcome/safety brief, a basic skills archery class, lunch, structured shooting, archery games, certificate presentation, culmination.
 - Archery Coaches and Volunteers will be needed (USA Archery Certified/BAI certified)
 - Eyeballing March 21st for execution (avoiding Easter Sunday and Palm Sunday)
 - Beaver Falls Sportsmen's Association registered as an official USA Archery Explore Archery Club to host the USA Archery "Explore Archery" Curriculum
 - Riverside High School NASP team expressed interest in supporting the event with coaching support.

NASP Basic Archery Instructor (BAI)

- Becoming a NASP BAI is free of charge; requires a hybrid/in-person course led by a NASP instructor (In PA; a PGC instructor)

- All BAIs must log 10 "in-school" hours of instruction annually to retain BAI certification.
- Upcoming BAI Courses include:
 - Wheeling, WV on 31 OCT 2025
 - Wheeling, WV on 1 NOV 2025

USA Archery Coaching Certification

- Anyone interested in Coaching Certification from USA Archery should sign up via their website and conduct online certification.
- Fees and prerequisites include:
 - USA Archery Membership - \$70 per year
 - USA Archery Online Level 1 certification – \$40 (onetime fee)
 - Center for SafeSport training – Free; must complete to be valid.
 - Background check – \$25 (every three years)

- Practical Course (In-Person) – Costs vary; Archery Director is currently taking the instructor-trainer course to offer this service to BCSCCL and Youth Foundation members for free.
- This certification allows you or your clubs to host a Junior Olympic Archery Development (JOAD) program or an Explore Archery program.

Legislative - Jim Stoker [FOAC Video on Recent Events](#)

This past week was a busy week for 2nd Amendment advocates in Harrisburg. Anti-gun Democrat leadership ran four bills on the floor trying to enact new gun control laws. FOAC was able to gather enough votes from Republican legislators to stop ERPO / Red Flag Laws (HB 1859), a Machinegun Conversion Devices Bill (HB 1866), and a bill attacking the private manufacture of firearms called the “Ghost gun / undetectable firearms” bill (HB 1099).

Unfortunately, one bill, HB 1593 Universal Background Checks, which is another way to say enforced gun registry, passed the House. There are four Republicans who feel their district expects them to vote in support of this concept, which comes strictly from a lack of education on the subject.

These bills were all placed on the floor in response to recent efforts by FOAC, PAGR and GOA to remove Rep. Frank Burns (D – Cambria County) from his seat and give power back to the pro-gun Republican leadership in the House. This is not speculation; this comes from the Democrat leadership. Burns is a fake 2A legislator, who's vote ensure the gun control bills get put to a vote, and then votes against them every time to weaponize them against Republican legislators.

It is FOAC's intentions to replace Burns with a pro-gun Republican candidate so that the anti-gun Democrat leadership loses power in the House and no more gun control bills can be put forth for a vote. This is non-partisan politics, in that the goal is to protect the 2nd Amendment no matter which side has to pay the price for it, it just so happens that there are no pro-gun legislators in the Democrat party in Harrisburg anymore.

FOAC is also happy to report that HB 1593 has been sent to the judiciary committee in the Senate, where it will die without further mention.

FOAC leadership also had a sit-down last week with Attorney General Dave Sunday and hopes to resolve some government agency oversteps we've been seeing in recent times under the Shapiro regime.

FOAC is also offering concealed carry seminars, and some new training sessions, such as church security training and security evaluations should you attend a church or know of any that could use assistance keeping their congregants safe.

- The PADEP issued a notice of violation to Highlands Sporting Clays, a range in Somerset County managed by Highland Ventures LLC. According to the DEP lead from the range found its way to Blue Hole Creek, which is popular with hikers, cyclists, and anglers. Youghiogheny Riverkeepers Association with the Mountain Watershed Association tested and found high levels of lead and other metals in the creek. Highlands has 60 days to submit an Environmental Stewardship Plan. If your club has a trap field, skeet, rifle range, or sporting clay course follow your best management practices like bullet and lead recovery and keep detailed documentation of all activities.
